Principal Message

Dear Wolves,

The College and Career Readiness Task Force continues to research, analyze and deliberate about high school bell schedules and start times. For more information on the process please visit the <u>Lake Washington School District webpage</u>.

The exploration of start times stems from concerns about sleep deprivation in teenagers, and the proposal to move back start times would align more to the circadian rhythms of teenagers. However, a recent article in the Huffington Post, entitled Here's the Real Way to Fix the Teen Sleep Loss Epidemic, explains that exposure to artificial light at night can also have a detrimental impact on teenage sleep patterns. The article recommends that teenagers limit their screen time before they try to fall asleep.

According to the National Institute of Health, less than 10 percent of teenagers sleep the recommended nine hours a night. This chronic sleep deprivation can have significant impacts, "including poor academic performance, issues with learning and memory, mental health conditions, and physical health complications including diabetes and obesity."

The article explains that "there may be some benefit to modestly delaying school start times in addition to educating teens about the effects of artificial light and excessive evening screen time."

Let's all take time over Spring Break to sleep and exercise. Our minds depend on it.

Underage Drinking - Know the Risks

- 90 % of underage drinking is in the form of binge drinking. People ages 12-20 drink 11 percent of all alcohol consumed in the U.S. Although young people drink less often than adults do, when they do drink, they drink more, exponentially increasing risks to health and safety.
- Drinking impairs judgment and can lead to poor decisions about engaging in risky behaviors that put one's self and others at risk.
- Teen brains are more vulnerable to alcohol. Research shows that the teen brain doesn't fully
 develop until 25. Alcohol can alter this development, potentially affecting brain structure and
 function.
- Underage drinking increases the risk of alcohol problems later in life. Research shows that people
 who start drinking before the age of 15 are four times more likely to meet the criteria for alcohol
 dependence at some point in their lives.




