State Testing Starts Soon

Washington public high school students take the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) for English Language Arts (ELA) and Math. Students also take an End of Course (EOC) exam in Biology. Results from these assessments provide meaningful feedback and data that teachers and other educators can use to help students succeed. In addition, the results provide data to help evaluate school-level and district-wide instructional strategies, initiatives and other programs. Students at Eastlake will be tested on the following dates:

May 15: 7:30 - 10:20, SBA ELA testing, class for all students will begin at 10:30

May 16: 7:30 - 10:20, SBA ELA testing, class for all students will begin at 10:30

May 22: 7:30 - 10:20, SBA Math testing, class for all students will begin at 10:30

May 23: 7:30 - 9:45, SBA Math testing, class for all students will begin at 9:50

June 5-8: Biology EOC, given during Biology classes

Who needs to take these tests?

SBA ELA - 10th grade students and any 11th/12th grade students that have not yet met the proficiency requirement

SBA Math - 10th grade students (see note below) and any 11th/12th grade students that have not yet met the proficiency requirement

Biology EOC - 10th grade students and any 11th/12th grade students that have not yet met the proficiency requirement.

A late start is being used by the comprehensive high schools to implement the state testing requirements. This schedule is necessary to provide a quality testing environment for students who are working towards their graduation requirements. A late bus run will be provided to ensure students who are not testing can be at school for the start of instruction during these days. The weekly schedules for these tests can be found on the Eastlake website in the [Daily Schedule](#) tab.

Tenth grade students may access the Math SBA

The class of 2019 is the first class that has the SBA Math test as a graduation requirement. 10th grade (2019) students may now also take the Smarter Balanced math assessment instead of waiting until the 11th grade. The Mathematics Smarter Balanced Assessment is designed for students who are completing or have already completed an Algebra 2 course. Grade 10 students that have not completed this level of math instruction would be at a disadvantage and may want to consider waiting until the 11th grade year to attempt the exam for the first time. Students who score a 3 or 4 on the SBA as a 10th grader will not need to take that exam during their 11th grade year.

Congratulations Eastlake Robotics - On Their Way to Worlds!

Congratulations to the Eastlake Robotics team "TOP GUN". In their first Pacific Northwest District competition in March, they made it to the semi finals and finished 3rd. They also won the award for overall quality of work.

At their second District Competition in March, individually the team placed 4th overall out of 40 teams and were picked by the 2nd place Captain to be a member of their alliance. After sweeping the quarterfinals, they played 3 hard fought semifinal matches where their alliance scored the highest recorded points in the playoffs across the entire Pacific Northwest to reach the finals.

Over spring break, Top Gun Robotics competed at the District Championships, playing against the top 64 robots from Alaska, Washington, and Oregon. Based on their performance at the Championships and the 2 previous events, Top Gun Robotics qualified as one of the top 39 teams from our district to go to the World Championships in Houston next week



where they will compete with over 400 teams from around the world. They will be flying out early Tuesday morning. Go Top Gun!
