Parents of students with IEP's, if your student has an IEP do you know who your IEP Provider is? This is important, because providers may or may not be one of your student's classroom teachers. If your son or daughter has an IEP and is a freshman (or is otherwise new to our school) then please meet in the library at 6:30. This is an opportunity to meet your child's provider and to learn about the special education services we offer at Eastlake High School with Transition Center, Resource Program, and Intervention Center. You can also ask general questions about our programs. There will not be time for individual questions specific to your child, but after you learn who your provider is you can follow up later with an email or phone call if all your questions are not answered.

Student class schedules - We will have each student's schedule inside our main entrance, just in case your student does not hand you his or her schedule on Monday. These are meant to be a backup plan though; we are hoping you can skip this line. The line is slow because we have 1900 schedules to look through for anyone who forgets to bring one.

Schedules will be emailed home: We will also send parents an email with your student's individual schedule. This is a new technique for our school, and since this will be our trial run we are still relying on students bringing home the paper versions. If this works well then next year we will rely on the email version.

Laptop insurance is more important now than ever because of two factors; increased incidents of theft from student cars and also the rising cost of replacing a lost or stolen laptop. The replacement cost for a laptop is \$450.00 but that price may increase. LWSD offers insurance through Worth Ave and you can purchase it for \$54.00 for one year. Eastlake Financial Aid and Scholarship Night.

Representatives from Seattle Pacific University Student Financial Services will explain what financial aid is, how to apply, what families should know about financial aid and how to find scholarships. Even if you think your family will not qualify for financial aid, many schools require the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) for scholarships so parents of juniors and seniors especially are encouraged to attend this event to learn about the process.

ACE Mentorship applications due 10/13

The ACE Mentorship program is designed for students who want to learn about a career in the building industry. Students work with mentors, go on field trips to job sites, and work on their own building design project guided by a team of mentors. Last year, 160 students from 56 area high schools finished the ACE program and

14 seniors were awarded a total of \$85,000 in scholarships. Since 2001, the ACE program has awarded \$570,000 in university scholarships for students who are studying in fields related to the building industry. - Students should be appropriately dressed to meet the school dress code.
- Digital images should be at least 300 dpi and in a .jpg, .tiff or eps format - Word, excel, publisher or other formats will not be accepted.
- Be sure to complete ALL requested fields so the image is assigned to the correct student.
