Counseling and Career Center Sign-ups

Does your student need to see their school counselor? We support Wolves in whatever they need, from helping through rough times to high school and college planning. Students can sign up anytime to see a member of the team by using the Counseling and Career Center Power School page. There's a link to an online clipboard, and within 24-48 hours we'll send a slip during class for that student.

It's PSAT time!

If your student is in 11th grade, this is the year for them to officially take the PSAT/NMSQT test at EHS on October 11, 2017. The test will be here at EHS and is built into the school day for Juniors. The test is optional, but about 90% of Juniors take this test. It will prepare students for the SAT and it will enter

students in the National Merit Scholarship program for recognition and scholarships. This is not to be confused with the Fear Free practice SAT tests offered on the weekends at EHS- this is the only test that will get them connected to national scholarships. The PSAT test is \$16 and you can purchase online with Parent Access or students can bring in payment- cash or check made out to EHS. Deadline to register for the test is October 4th, 2017. There will be no refunds after October 4th due to administrative and test costs. 10th graders will take the PSAT with no registration or fee required.
