Dear Eastlake Community:

Thank you for your steadiness during this time of uncertainty, and for your partnership in helping our kids make sense of it all.

We understand that some students may be scared about COVID-19 because they have a compromised immune system or live with someone in a high-risk category. Some students might feel disconnected because the relationships they have at school with other students and staff keeps them centered and strong. Other students may feel devastated by the closure because it's their senior year in sports. Maybe they have a part in the play or have looked forward to playing their instrument in an upcoming concert, or maybe they missed an opportunity to sing in Carnegie Hall. Our kids need us now!

As a community, we have an important role around public safety. It remains incumbent on us to encourage students to take the guidelines from the CDC and Public Health Department seriously. Students need to take action to break the link of transmission.

Mr. Rogers said, "when I was a boy and I would see scary things in the news, my mother would say to me, 'look for the helpers you will always find people who are helping.'" Now is your time to choose to join the helpers.

4. In times of crisis how have communities rallied together in the past (what are the variety of actions people have taken)? What continuities do we see right now? What is different about this situation now and our responses?

Small actions like social distancing and washing hands will save lives across our country.

In the coming days, teachers may post a discussion board so students can participate in this conversation online.
