Principal Message

Dear Families,

Our Tolo is Saturday, March 17th from 8-11 PM. Please encourage your kids to come to Tolo and stay until the end. If a student never arrives or chooses to leave the dance early, they are no longer supervised. Please know where your students are before the dance, when they leave the dance and where they go after the dance.

Although we have safety concerns about "party buses", we understand that some students will still arrive on these buses. When the buses arrive at Eastlake, we will require all students to exit the bus and enter the school dance. Students cannot stay on the bus on our campus. If they remain on the bus, the bus may be subject to a search. When students leave the dance, they cannot return, so students arriving on a bus need to coordinate with each other on their departure time.

We also have safety concerns about the after parties, and have dealt with several situations where kids find themselves in compromising situations, usually after consuming alcohol, and even when the parents are home. As a reminder, "social hosting" is against the law.

What is "social hosting"?

Social hosting is similar to "duty of care" laws that hold bars and restaurants accountable when they over serve and/or serve minors. Social hosting creates responsibilities on the part of "social" hosts, such as homeowners, to persons affected by drinking on their property.

Washington Law

RCW 66.44.270 states "it is unlawful for any person to sell, give, or otherwise supply liquor to any person under the age of twenty-one years or permit any person under that age to consume liquor on his or her premises or on any premises under his or her control" (this would include rental properties for prom weekend). Penalties include fines up to \$5,000 and up to one year in jail. Additional penalties would be in place if any minor was injured in any way.

Fighting the idea of "but these are good kids"

We are very lucky to be a school that is full of good kids. But, bottom line is, good kids still have teenage brains. And, teenage brains, regardless of how awesome a kid is, can still act on impulse, engage in

risky behavior and are less likely to think before they act.

What you can do:

- Know where your child is and have them check in regularly.
- If you're going to be away overnight, have a relative or friend keep an eye out or have your child stay where they will have supervision.
- If they have a place to go after Tolo and promise they won't drink in order to avoid adult supervision, provide adult supervision anyway to ensure that alcohol isn't present
- Talk to other parents that your child will be with to make sure you're all on the same page about your expectations

Report any underage drinking to local law enforcement.

We need to work together as a community to ensure a fun but safe experience for our kids.

Ribbon Cutting Ceremony - Eastlake Fastpitch

This major field upgrade, including an artificial surface for the infield and complete new infrastructure was 100% funded by the LWSD Facility Improvement Levy. These major improvements bring Eastlake's softball/fastpitch complex up to LWSD standards and make it one of the top facilities in the state. Lady Wolves Basketball Finish Great Season - State RE-CAP

The Lady Wolves had an epic Journey that took them all the way to a 5th place in the state finish at the Tacoma Dome.

Playoffs began in a Regional round victory against 7th seeded Lake Stevens 65-49. Mae Bryant finished the afternoon with 20 points and 11 rebounds, and Gina Marxen added 15 points and 5 assists.

After an amazing send off from the school, the Lady Wolves opened up with Camas in a rematch game from last year's state tournament, leaving no room for error with a final score of 58-27. The wolves had 4 players in double digits (Keeli, Cameron, Gina and Mae). Mae locked in another double double with 12 points and 13 rebounds. The win marked a rematch with Woodinville in the semi finals the following night.

Friday night the Wolves faced off with an oh so familiar competitor, Woodinville. The wolves lost a heartbreaker in overtime 78-80. Lady Wolves gave up some 3s early but never gave up hope. Riddled with fouls the bench stepped up huge, giving the Wolves a spark to tie the game up at the end of regulation 71-71. Unfortunately, the Wolves fell short in OT. Keeli Burton finished the night with 30 points, shot 8-9 from free-throw line and had 22 rebounds. Gina Marxen contributed 14 points, was a perfect 4-4 from the line, and had 13 assists. Kenzie Feinglas, and Callie Lind stepped up huge on the defensive end trying to make things difficult for the Woodinville guards in the backcourt. The Lady Wolves gave everything they had that night, and the support that the school and our parents gave that night will never be forgotten. Thanks for being apart of that amazing game.

Saturday morning...trophy day. With the loss to Woodinville the Lady Wolves faced Moses Lake in the 3rd/5th place game. As they always do, the Wolves fought and clawed their way to the final buzzer. Despite a tie ball game at the end of the 3rd quarter, the Lady Wolves were not able to outlast Moses Lake and were defeated 71-55. Keeli Burton led the Wolves with 16 points and 9 rebounds, Gina contributed 10 points and 8 assists, and Callie Lind added 8 points.

The run to 5th place was fantastic. Thank you all for being there along the way.
