Dear Wolves:

We hope this message finds you healthy and well. We have been working hard to create a schedule and define expectations as you prepare to reengage in new learning starting on April 20th. While these are new and uncharted times for your education, we are committed to providing an enriching learning experience to all students.

Students will begin required assignments on Monday, April 20th. Students will have approximately 3-5 hours of assigned learning each day. This will include approximately 30-45 minutes per class per day or 15-25 hours/week. Each Monday, teachers will post assignments and communicate with families about the new learning expectations for the week. This could be a schedule for the week with daily activities or a longer project to be completed over multiple days.

Lessons and assignments will be developed so that they can be easily accessed at different times by students. This allows students, families, and teachers to work flexibly while addressing the different demands on their time and availability caused by the current situation. However, teachers will be scheduling time for connections with their class(es) in real-time through weekly office hours. These connections will be available through discussion boards, video-conferencing and email. In order for teachers to provide live teaching experiences for students without creating conflicts, we created the following schedule.

Schedule Explanation:

- The assigned class time is a window in which teachers may engage students in live learning activities
- Teachers will communicate their offerings in a weekly email sent on Monday
- Teachers may use one or both of these windows to check in and connect via

- email, video-conferencing, chat, discussion boards, etc. in real-time.
- Students should 'attend' these sessions during this time whenever possible. Students are expected to have an online presence with their teachers since there are expectations for completion of assignments (participation in discussions, assignments, assessments).
 - There will be opportunities for students to access the information from this live teaching experience at another time if they are unable to 'attend' during the window.
 - This schedule was determined using our Building Decision Making model and will be revisited after a two-week trial period.

This week we also asked students to review and finalize their 2020-2021 registration. Due to the current circumstances we understand concerns that they may not be ready for the subsequent level of instruction next year. We understand that students missed one month of new instruction and although it begins again this week, teachers will not be able to proceed through the curriculum at the same pace.

It's important to remember that all students, in all classes, in Lake Washington and around the country will be in a similar situation. Our teachers have identified the most essential standards to teach this year, and if there are any standards that they will not get to that are foundational to subsequent classes, then we will adjust our curriculum next year for courses that are part of a sequence, to address gaps in learning.

Student Access Into Eastlake

Many students will need to enter our school to drop off/pick up things for their classes. Some students will have one-time needs while others will have occasional and ongoing needs. We have developed the following schedule so our school will be open to students twice each week; once on Mondays and once on Fridays. We will use this schedule every week starting Monday April 20th.

1:30 – 2:00 U-Z

Friday Last Name

9:00-9:30 A-D

10:00-10:30 I-L

10:30-11:00 M-P

11:00-11:30 Q-T

11:30-12:00 U-Z

Students who come in should first communicate with their teacher so they know something will be ready for students to pick up, or so teachers know something will be dropped off. If no teacher asked you to come in then there is nothing for you to pick up. Examples include picking up a textbook or laptop that was left in a classroom, picking up or dropping off a novel for Humanities, picking up paper copies of

assignments or assessments that could not be accessed online, and picking up art supplies and art projects.

Instructions For Entering the Building

Students will enter through the main entrance. There will be lines of tape every six feet to help maintain social distancing. Students will see tables arranged from the main entrance to the library, with the tables labeled Science, Math, Humanities, etc. Go to the table you need, then look for a folder or basket with your teacher's name, then pick up or drop off whatever you need for that teacher. Masks and gloves are optional for students. Staff who are helping students will wear masks and gloves. Students and staff need to remain at least six feet from each other.

Special instructions will apply to some student needs:

- Spring athletes who need to turn in uniforms will receive specific instructions from their coach.
- PE Lockers will be cleaned out using this schedule, with Freshmen on April 27 and May 1 followed by Sophomores – Seniors on May 4 and May 8. There will be a reminder of this in next week's WWU.
- Art students will receive specific instructions from their art teacher.
- Instructions to empty and clean out hall lockers will be in next week's WWU.
- Parents will be able to pick up their student's medicine in early June.
