This week was our fifth annual Wolf Strong Week. Instead of a culture by default, this week's activities and theme focused on creating a culture by design. The theme for this year's Wolf Strong Week was "**Own your ImPACKt**" and students were encouraged to engage with those around them and seek out ways to serve and recognize others. On average, we impact over 80,000 people in our lifetimes and by acknowledging this and trying to make those impacts positive, students are working to improve their school culture through intentional and thoughtful actions. Throughout the week, leadership students organized a host of activities to promote this attitude of giving and recognizing others. Two of the larger activities included the honoring of our cafeteria and custodial staffs with the "Lunch Lady Luncheon" and serving our staff with an "inside-out car wash" by the students. Additionally, staff and students wrote and delivered "imPACKt" (thank you) cards, made pancakes in the parking lot, played music and hi-fived students as they entered school. We hosted two assemblies and facilitated staff recognition of impactful students. The week culminates tonight with the Eastlake Unified Basketball team taking on Skyline at EHS. The tailgate (sponsored by the Wolves Football Association) will start at 4:00 and the game will begin at 5:00 with giveaways and activities at halftime! The leadership students deserve a huge kudos for their hard work to make this all happen! AP Exam Packet Distribution

AP Exam packets will be passed out on Tuesday, April 30th, before school between 7:00-7:30am in the main entrance of the school. This packet includes the student's test schedule, AP number, and directions on how to access test scores this summer. It is vital students pick up their packet since they cannot test without it! Students will need to bring picture ID with them such as their Student ID or Driver's License. They will not get a packet if they don't show ID. Students cannot pick up a packet for another student. Packets not picked up that morning will be in the Counseling Office.

AP Exam Refunds

Students who have decided not to take the test or are unable to take it may request a refund. The refund form may be requested from Ms. Olson, AP Coordinator via email at polson@lwsd.org or in person in the Counseling Office. All refund forms are due no later than 6/14/19 to Ms. Olson. Students can request a refund for any reason and will receive payment in the summer. There is a \$20 refund fee per exam. If you have any questions please email Ms. Olson.

Eastlake Students Collect and Donate School Supplies to Children in Peru

Mrs. Don Chokr's AP Spanish students are working toward earning their AP with WE Service certificate. The AP students researched the effect of poverty on education. With that end, as part of the global action component, the students carried out a service project intended to make a positive impact on the lives of school children in Peru. Small groups of AP students presented to 5 different groups of 32+ students during Wolf Time. They created a PowerPoint to explain their research and led simulation activities in each classroom so students could experience the effects of poverty on achievement firsthand. In addition to the presentations, they also organized a school-wide school and hygiene supplies drive. They collected over 200 pounds of donations.

They gave the supplies to a group of 14 Eastlake students who traveled to Peru with Mrs. Don Chokr and Ms. Egashira during Spring Break. The group delivered over half of the supplies to a small elementary school in Calca. They learned that one of the students walked an hour to get to public transportation and then rode the bus for another half hour just to get to school. They were given a tour of the school and the opportunity to play soccer and interact with the children. The group delivered the rest of the supplies to small communities on Lake Titicaca.
