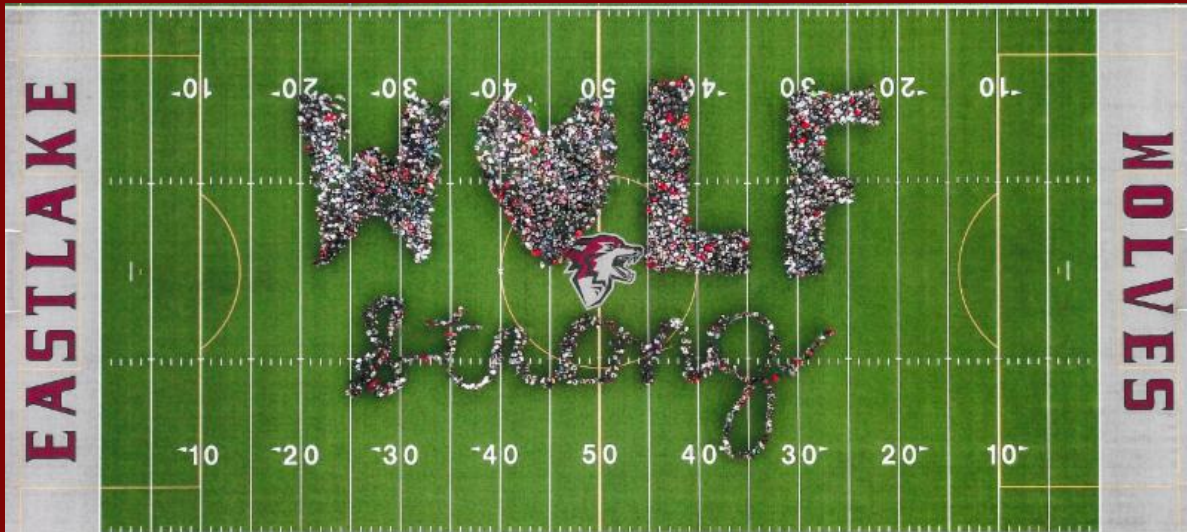

State Testing May 20-23

Students at Eastlake will be tested on the following dates with this [bell schedule](#):

Who needs to take these tests?

SBA ELA – All 10th grade students and any 11th/12th grade students that have not yet met the requirement.

SBA Math – All 10th grade students and any 11th/12th grade students that have not yet met the requirement.

WCAS Science – All 11th grade students are required to take this one-day Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science.

May 20-21: 7:30-10:25, SBA ELA testing for parts 1 and 2. Classes start at 10:30, this is a two-day test

May 22 or 23: 7:30 – 10:25, WCAS Science testing. Classes start at 10:30, this is a one-day test

May 22: 7:30 -10:25, SBA Math testing part 1. Classes start at 10:35, this is a two-day test

May 23: 7:30 -9:40, SBA Math testing part 2. From 9:45 - 10:25 we will have a celebration for students to enjoy and relax after completing their state testing. Classes for all students start at 10:30.

May 24: Periods 1-7 meet from 7:30 – 2:20. This day is a normal Monday schedule.

What if a student is absent or can't take this test? We will have make-up testing starting at 1:00 on the next two Wednesdays: May 29 and June 5. We will contact these students. If students do not pass this year then they will have more opportunities next year. If your student cannot attend any of these make up dates please contact us (see below).

How do I know if my student has already passed?

- 11th and 12th grade: We are contacting individual students who need to take these tests. You can also go to Skyward, select Test Results on the left side of the screen, and if you see SBA then click to see if your son/daughter passed.
- 10th grade: All sophomores are required to take the SBA ELA and SBA Math tests.
- 9th grade: Freshmen are not allowed to take any test yet, even if they'd like to.

What to Bring to the Test

- Computer and charger
- Earbuds (bring the kind with the cord, not wireless)
- Computer mouse (optional)
- Water and a snack
- Book to read when finished. Homework that does not involve a laptop is also OK.

Regular and Late Bus Routes

- Buses will arrive at all bus stops at the normal times on testing days, for students who need to take state tests.
- Buses will also make a late run on testing days, for students who are not scheduled to take state tests this year. These late buses will arrive at Eastlake at approximately 10:15. The exact times will be sent to students and parents prior to testing.

How does the new state law impact state testing?

- We don't know yet, but individual school districts do have some discretion to

implement this law in different ways. Our students tend to pass these tests, so our advice is for students to show up and do their best on every test.
