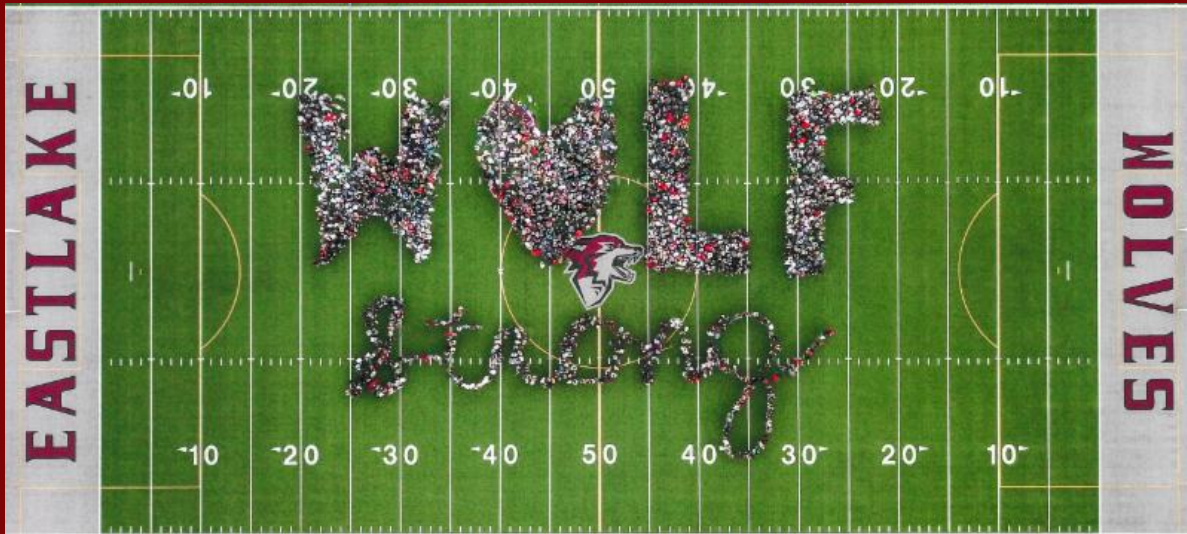

We will make some modifications to our parking lot to improve traffic flow and student safety. School Buses Week of May 20th - IMPORTANT

Our buses will pick up students twice each morning on testing days (Mon-Thur) next week. The first bus run will be at the normal times so students can be here for tests that start at 7:30am (all sophomores and some juniors/seniors). Then they will make a second run approximately two and a half hours later so non-testing students arrive at roughly 10:15am, for their classes that start at 10:30am (all freshmen and most

juniors/seniors). All students who ride a bus will receive an email from LWSD Transportation this weekend with the exact time for your student's bus stop.

State Testing - Week of May 20th

We have state testing next week Monday through Thursday. Tests start at 7:30am, and we have a late arrival for students who are not testing. Friday is a full school day for everyone. Here is next week's [bell schedule](#).

Students who are not testing can enter the Commons but will need to remain there until 10:20am. The rest of the school will be closed, so testing students have a calm and quiet testing environment.

Students can check the rosters on the Commons wall to find their testing classrooms.

- English Language Arts: Monday and Tuesday for **all sophomores and some juniors/seniors (two days)**. Students are required to take and pass this test.
- Math: Wednesday and Thursday for all **sophomores and some juniors/seniors (two days)**. Students are required to take and pass this test.
- Science: **All juniors** on either Wednesday or Thursday (this is a one-day test). All juniors are required to take this test.

Students who are testing need to be in their testing classrooms by 7:30am for tests Monday – Thursday. We have a 10:30am late start for students who do not have testing. Friday is a normal day.

Important Points for State Tests:

- The tests are not timed. Students who are not finished by 10:30am will be brought to the library to continue until they are finished.
- We will have make-up testing for any students who are absent. This will be after school on the following two Wednesdays (May 30 and June 6).
- Charge your computer for these tests and bring your charger to school.
- You must use your school computer, not your own personal laptop. If you have not used your school laptop for a while then please come in early and restart ... you'll need to get the updates you missed.
- You cannot have Skype for Business or any other program running in the background. If you don't know how to close this program then ask your testing room proctor for help.
- **Bring wired earbuds** for the audio parts of the test. Don't bring Bluetooth earbuds. We have some to loan, but we encourage you to bring yours.
- You can bring a mouse if you'd like to. A mouse is not required, but it's OK.
- You can bring a water bottle or snack if you'd like.
- If you are normally quick on tests, then you'll probably be quick on this one too. You will need to close your computer when you finish. Books and papers are OK but phones and laptops and smart watches and calculators are not. Bring homework to do, or a book to read. You will not be able to touch your electronics until everyone in your room has finished their tests. If you do, your test may be invalidated. Please don't work on homework from the same subject as your testing room (if you just finished a math test, don't pull out math homework ... work on a different subject).
- Restart your computer before you start the test, to make sure all updates have

been installed.
