#### **About:**

#BlackLivesMatter was founded in 2013 in response to the acquittal of Trayvon Martin’s murderer. Black Lives Matter Foundation, Inc is a global organization in the US, UK, and Canada, whose mission is to eradicate white supremacy and build local power to intervene in violence inflicted on Black communities by the state and vigilantes. By combating and countering acts of violence, creating space for Black imagination and innovation, and centering Black joy, we are winning immediate improvements in our lives.

### **Eastlake is Open for Students on Monday June 15th:**

As a reminder, students can come into Eastlake every Monday from 11-2. to pick up or drop off assignments and supplies for their classes.

### **June 16-18 Student Check-Out for Grades 9-11:**

Students in Grades 9-11 will check-in school materials such as their laptop, charger and textbooks on June 16-18 during their designated timeslot. They will also pick-up Yearbooks and the contents from their hallway and PE lockers. Students need to wear a mask and maintain social distancing. Masks will be available for students who do not

bring their own.

Students will arrive on campus during their designated timeslot. As they walk towards the entrance to school, our staff members will direct them before they enter so they maintain social distancing.

Additional materials that students may need to return include library books, sports uniform, band uniform or a checked-out calculator or camera from class. Students may also need to pick-up Art or AVID boxes.

Students have been submitting their final assignments this week. Teachers will not assign new work. If necessary, students have until June 19 to turn in missing assignments and can therefore turn in their laptops and textbooks at that time as well.

In order to collect all materials in a safe manner that aligns with social distancing protocols we will need to divide students by last name and spread this over three days. It's important that students adhere to their assigned time slot so we can be safe and avoid long lines!

#### **2019-20 Yearbooks:**

Yearbooks will be distributed when students come for their check-out. Follow these steps to see if you have purchased a Yearbook for your student:

- Login to [www.lwsd.org](http://www.lwsd.org) and select Find It Fast from the top right corner
- Select 'Pay Fees Online' and then select 'Online Payments' and then enter login information.
- Then select your student's name, then under Reports- select Purchase History
- From here scroll and use the arrows at the top to see a full history of all purchases made. If you see the item EHS YEARBOOK 2019-20 then you have purchased a Yearbook this year.

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## Library/Technology

### Student Passwords:

Office 365 requires students to change their password every 90 days. Usually this is done at school on their laptops by going to "control+alt+delete" and then selecting "change password". That doesn't work off campus. Students need to register for the password recovery tool so they can change it themselves from any device.

Please do this before June 19th so you can access email over the summer until about August 15th. After that the accounts are re-set for a new school year so there will be an interruption in service until laptop roll out.

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
