The Eastlake Mission outlines our efforts to develop both the intellectual strengths and character in students.

We want students to know the quadratic formula and understand the lessons of history, but we also want them to learn how to think critically, creatively and independently. To translate our mission into action, we challenge and engage students in effective instruction. We want students to transcend strategic compliance and become authentically engaged, where they perceive their schoolwork as interesting, important and relevant. Where they don't just go through the motions and play school, but rather get fired up about issues and fascinated by the complexities of the world around them.

Our teachers understand the brain science of attention spans and use this knowledge to inform their lesson pacing and transitions.

At Eastlake, we have a relentless focus on the culture of school and the quality of instruction inside the classroom.

Picture Make Up Day - September 19th

Picture make up day is Wednesday, September 19th, starting when classes end at 12:25. Life Touch photographers will set up in the Upper Commons. Students need to see the bookkeeper **before** joining the picture line. **This picture make up day is for students who have not taken their picture yet.** This picture is for student ID and ASB cards, off campus passes, and also for any picture packages that families may want to purchase. If you ride the bus, please be thinking about an alternate way to get home that day. Buses will be on their regular Wednesday schedule starting at 12:55.

Note: Before an off-campus pass can be issued parents need to complete the [online permission form](#) and [pay any fines](#).

Picture retakes will be on October 24th for students who have a picture, don't like it, and want a better one. Of course, students could still get their picture taken for the first time that day too.

It's PSAT Time!

All 10th grade students are automatically registered to take the PSAT. If your student is in **11th grade**, they have the option to take the PSAT/NMSQT test at EHS on **October 10, 2017**. The test will be here at EHS and is built into the school day. Though it is optional, about 90% of Juniors take the test. It will prepare students for the SAT and it will enter students in the National Merit Scholarship program for recognition and scholarships.

This is not to be confused with the *Fear Free practice SAT tests offered on the weekends at EHS*- this is the only test that will get them connected to national scholarships.

Cost of the PSAT test is \$16 and can be purchased online through [Parent Access](#) or students can bring in payment- cash or check made out to EHS and pay at the bookkeepers window.

Deadline to register for the test is October 3rd, 2017. No refunds after October 4th because of administrative and test costs. 10th graders will take the PSAT with no registration or fee required. Please see [Mr. Jones](#) in the main office if you have questions.

World Language Competency Test - October 3 2018

The [World Competency Test](#) is for students who already have proficiency in a world language and are not already earning credit for that language through a class. The Lake Washington School District will offer four testing opportunities for 9th-12th grade students in 2018-19. The cost of a first attempt during a student's high school career is free. Juanita will host the first test on October 3, 2018. Deadline to sign up is September 27 2018. For more information and registration instructions click on the World Competency Test link above.
