

2016-17 School Goals

- Literacy: 97% at standard, 99% or greater at standard in the Listening and Speaking Claim
- Math: >80% at standard
- Science: 77% at standard
- Achievement gap: Decrease the percent of students with an IEP who earn an F in one or more classes to fewer than 10%
- On-Track Credits: Increase the percentage of 9th graders earning 6 credits to 95%
- College & Career Readiness: Reduce the percent of the starting student count who drop AP or UW courses to 4% or less
- School Effectiveness: Increase the percentage of teachers who agree with the statement "Teachers receive regular feedback on how they are doing" to >70%. Increase the percentage of teachers who agree with the statement "Staff members get help in areas they need to improve" to >70%
- Attendance: Reduce the number of overall absences by 10% from the previous school year. Students with 5 or more unexcused absences will decrease by 10% Additionally, the average number of total absences for those students will decrease to fewer than 20.
- Discipline: Increase the percentage of students who are suspended who maintain or increase their GPA during the semester in which they are suspended to 55%





11th Grade English Language Arts







- >Test scores are above 95%
- +Smarter Balanced Assessment is a Washington state standardized exam. Scores represent percentage of students who met the standards. Students who did not take the test were counted as not meeting standard.
- *Scores are suppressed when groups are so small that the information could potentially be used to identify or derive information about individual students. Many 11th grade students refused to take the test: they may have already met graduation requirements through passing the old state tests in 10th grade.
- **The Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and the American College Test (ACT) are required by many colleges and universities for admission. Students elect to take these tests. A new SAT was given starting in January 2016. The Reading and Writing sections have been consolidated and now make up "Evidence-Based Reading and Writing" (ERW). As a result, the previous year's data is no longer comparable.
